Linda Steele

Linda Steele is an Associate Professor in the Faculty of Law, University of Technology Sydney (Australia). She is a socio-legal scholar leading a program of research 'Truth Justice Repair' on redress and social repair of violence, institutionalisation and segregation experienced by people with disability. Linda is author of Disability, Criminal Justice and Law (2020, Routledge) and co-editor of Sites of Conscience: Place, Memory and the Project of Deinstitutionalization (forthcoming UBC Press, with E. Punzi) and The Legacies of Institutionalisation: Disability, Law and Policy in the 'Deinstitutionalised' Community (2020, Hart Publishing, with C. Spivakovsky and P. Weller).



Harry Rutner

Harry Rutner has a double degree in Law and Social Work (Honours) and has been a practising Lawyer in Australia since 2019. Harry has worked in the disability sector for over 14 years as an advocate, social worker and solicitor. Harry currently works for the Australian Centre for Disability Law and the Consortium for Street Children (UK). As a solicitor, Harry represented clients with disability at the Australian Human Rights Commission, courts and tribunals, providing advice on human rights matters, specialising in disability discrimination matters. As a solicitor in Australia, Harry also created the Disability Legal Service to support people with disability across Western Sydney. Harry is currently the Co-Chair of the Australian Lawyers for Human Rights Disability Subcommittee and represented Civil Society in Australia at the 16th Session Of The Conference Of States Parties To The CRPD in New York in 2023.
